I hope you all have found, as I have, that the first rehearsals for our Light Music Gala Spectacular in December have been not only very enjoyable, but enlightening, as we have come to know repertoire — many of the pieces are new to us — and are beginning to appreciate their varied moods, styles and subtle and often brilliant orchestration. A light music programme is challenging in many ways - technically and interpretively - but I am pleased with the orchestra's response to these challenges.

I believe our programme contains all the ingredients required to make it thoroughly enjoyable for our audience, with a good balance between substantial pieces such as Farnon's *A la Claire Fontaine*, Delius' *La Calinda* and Haydn Wood's *Mannin Veen*, and the lighter, shorter mood of novelty pieces such *The Devil's Galop*, *The Girl from Corsica* and the *Elizabethan Serenade*.

I am sure that the afternoon of Sunday 4th December will live long in the memory, and will send everyone home with a lighter heart.
