During the past few weeks, the full extent of Schubert's musical genius and orchestral craftsmanship have been revealed in the third symphony, completed just a few months after his eighteenth birthday. There's a wealth of colourful detail to include which has brought the music to life for us.

The orchestral scoring of the Bruch Violin Concerto is no mere accompaniment to the soloist; there are many wonderful melodic lines for each section of the orchestra to enjoy. When Katie adds the solo part from Wednesday 12th July, it will be the icing on the cake.

Technically difficult they may be, but everyone has risen to the challenge of the Weber and Dag Wiren. It's all coming together very nicely. I'm enjoying it - I hope you are too!
